A heartfelt thank you for making last Monday and Tuesday's parent information evenings such a resounding success! Your presence created a vibrant and positive atmosphere, setting the tone for a collaborative and exciting teaching and learning journey for our girls and boys in 2025.



During my presentation, I highlighted several important points that underpin our mission at St. Nicholas. At the heart of our school is our cherished **Christian and Anglican ethos**, guided by our motto, "God Leads." Our assemblies and gatherings are rooted in biblical teachings, emphasising that our actions must speak louder than our words (theme from 2024). This principle aligns beautifully with our 2025 theme: "Learning, Growing, and Flourishing." As we nourish through teaching, we will flourish in every endeavour.

Safety Protocols

The safety of our girls, boys and staff is paramount. We discussed the drop-off and pick-up area on Jabu Ndlovu Street, where a security guard is stationed for added safety. Each parent will receive an electronic access card with the school logo, which must be presented to the guard to gain entry. This protocol is a proactive step to ensure a secure environment for everyone at St. Nicholas. Please bear with the security guard when he asks you or the person picking up your child for this access card. Please pass on this electronic version of the access card to the person/persons picking up your child. Please also ensure that an adult enters the school to collect your child and not other little children from other schools. Your children must be fetched from the following points:

- Pre-primary to Grade 3 aftercare playground
- Grade 4 7 are as follows:
- 14h00 15h00 (from the playground and courts)
- 15h00 16h00 (Grade 4 & 5 from the library; Garde 6 & 7 from Mrs Goosen's class)
- 16h00 17h00 (aftercare gate)
- After 17h00 (security guard gate on Shepstone Avenue)

Injury Protocols

Given our dynamic school environment with numerous activities, sports practices, and matches, injuries may occasionally occur. Rest assured, we have a clear plan in place:

- You will be notified immediately if your child is injured.
- The injury will be assessed by me, and if necessary, your child will be taken to Dr. Gumede for a professional diagnosis.
- In emergencies, an ambulance will be called, or the child will be taken to the hospital, where a school representative will meet you.
- These injuries and emergencies are covered by the school insurance that you pay as part of the school fees. When your child is ill, like flu, coughing, asthma, etc these will not be covered by the medical insurance and you will be called to pick up your child and take him/her to your GP/doctor at your expense. The child will be kept in the sick bay until you can fetch the child. Please note, that the new law does not allow us to administer any medication whatsoever without a written letter from the parent.

School Code of Conduct

The school code of conduct is an essential document designed to protect and support our girls, boys and staff. We request all parents to read and discuss this document with their children before signing and returning it to the class teachers.

Communication Protocols

Open and constructive communication is vital for addressing concerns about your child's well-being:

- 1. First, reach out to your child's class teacher to set up a meeting.
- 2. If unresolved, contact the relevant Head of Department (HOD) for further assistance. Pre-primary to Grade Head of department is Ms Brown (<u>brownj@stnicholas.co.za</u>) and Grades 4 7 Head of department is Mrs Hyland (<u>hylands@stnicholas.co.za</u>).
- 3. Should the matter still require attention, please arrange a meeting with the HOD and me (kamal@stnicholas.co.za). Together, we will find the best way forward with a focus on what benefits the child.

Lost Property vs. Expenses

While we encourage children to take responsibility for their belongings, they often misplace uniform items and fail to claim them from the lost property. School uniforms are a significant expense, and as a parent of a school-going child, I fully understand these costs. It is common for children to misplace their uniforms at school. However, returning these lost items to their rightful owners becomes impossible if they are not labeled with your child's name. To help reduce unnecessary expenses and save you the inconvenience of replacing lost items, I kindly appeal to all parents to label every piece of your child's uniform clearly.
